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Summary

I'm a third-generation oil man.

My lifelong passion has been the exploration and production of gas and oil. But lately I'm best known for media relations, crisis management, and high-level negotiations with federal and state governments.

On January 1, 2010, I was promoted to my dream job, COO of Energy & Production for Exxon. Three months later I found myself leading Exxon's emergency response to the Deepwater Millenium Oil Spill in the Gulf of Mexico.

Within a few days we organized a task force – almost an army – consisting of 48,000 people, 7,000 boats, and 150 aircraft. I set up a special team to brief senior government officials, including Cabinet Members and the White House around the clock.

As Exxon's point man for the spill, I informed the press and represented the company during what turned out to be the most intensely covered event in TV history.

I was not at all accustomed to being in the spotlight. Right after graduating from Texas A&M, Class of 1983, I joined Exxon and headed for the oil and gas fields of OK and TX. During the 28 years that followed, I focused on improving oil operations in remote parts of the world that most people have never heard of.

I'd need more than 2000 characters to describe everything that was happening behind-the-scenes during those six months while I was leading Exxon's emergency response.

I officially "retired" from Exxon in April, but you'll never see me retiring from the oil business. I learned a lot about the global oil business – the politics, the media, the dangers, the courageous people who do the work – and I really look forward to putting all that knowledge to good use for my future employers and clients.

Specialties

- Represented Exxon as media spokesperson during six months of intense media scrutiny – the longest single event in TV history.
- Negotiated agreements with state governors, congressional committees, cabinet officers, and the White House.
- Orchestrated sweeping organizational changes that ensured the future viability of Exxon, the world's third-largest company.
